## **Pupil Premium Statement 2019-20**

For 2019-2020 the amount of Pupil Premium allocated will be £1320 for each 'Ever6' FSM pupil and £2300 for each Looked After Child or post-Looked After Child.

The Pupil Premium Grant is to be used to raise the attainment of 'Ever6', LAC pupils and post-LAC pupils and close the gap between free school meal (FSM) and non-FSM pupils. Here at Stalmine we are committed to making every penny of the Pupil Premium count.

The amount of Pupil Premium allocated for 2019/2020 is £20100. In line with our School Development Plan to raise attainment of disadvantaged and Pupil Premium children we will allocate funding for 2019/2020 in the following areas:

- To accelerate progress in Literacy and Numeracy
- To provide targeted Speech and Language support
- To improve curriculum opportunities for children resources/clubs/visits etc.
- Provide emotional / social support and intervention for identified groups
- To improve standards in behaviour
- To provide personalised learning opportunities mentoring, 1-to-1 support, intervention
